

Ordinance # 369

AN ORDINANCE TO ALLOW EMERGENCY EXPENDITURES TO RE-ESTABLISH ESSENTIAL SERVICES FOR THE TOWN OF ASHLAND CITY, ASHLAND CITY, TENNESSEE.

WHEREAS, an unprecedented flood occurred in Ashland City, Tennessee as well as the jurisdictional limits of Cheatham County starting May 1, 2010 and continuing until May 8, 2010, and;

WHEREAS, in the flood the Town of Ashland City received catastrophic damage throughout the City which included the water plant, public works plant, sewer plant, parks, and other properties, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the City's Charter the Council finds that it is necessary to allow expenditures not to exceed \$500,000 to re-establish essential services to the city's services. This is being done on an emergency basis due to the dire straits of certain facilities in Ashland City and to try to re-establish services,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ASHLAND CITY, TENNESSEE THAT:

The expenditures of an amount not to exceed \$500,000 is hereby approved for any expenditure related to the flood of May 1, 2010 to re-establish essential service to the Town of Ashland City. This shall be effective retroactive to cover expenditures starting from May 1, 2010 for a period of ninety (90) days until August 1, 2010.

This ordinance shall take effect from and after its final passage the public welfare requiring it.
