






# **Spring has Sprung!**

Additional options include Bluetooth connectivity and speaker phone.

The CapTel® phone is available at no cost with a signed certification from a professional qualified to evaluate hearing loss, such as your audiologist or doctor. CapTel® service is provided at no cost to the user through a fund set up by the FCC exclusively for people with hearing loss.
