
EVERYTHING PUMPKIN CONTEST

This wonderful day trip allows for you to celebrate the season without chainsaws and blood. Just enough scare in the air to make you know something is out there! And, although it is optional, there will be a prize for the BEST COSTUME—not including the Cricket's!

We launch from the Tractor Supply upper parking lot at 8:30 a.m. and head to Schlabach's Mennonite Bakery where they have delicious homemade treats. We then will do some trick or treating at the historically restored Old Oaks Farm Home located in the Kentucky countryside.

For lunch we will head to The Glenn Federation of Women's Clubs' House for a private catered luncheon. This historical home is in the heart of the historic district of Springfield.

After lunch, we make our way past the smoking tobacco barns for which this region is still famous to the lovely hamlet of Adams, Tennessee which is proud to be home of the infamous BELL WITCH! Long a tradition in this community, this is the only spirit ever to have confessed to murder! And she will be our hostess today and even available for selfies if you dare! The master of ceremonies will be Jimmy the Cricket's own undertaker and friend Bob Bell who directly John Bell—the murdered victim of the witch! As owner

of Tennessee's oldest funeral parlor (Austin & Bell since 1842), Bob will delight you with very personal family tales and lore as nobody else can. As an added treat for the trip only, you will also have direct descendants of Kate Batts, the woman who most claimed to be the Bell Witch. You will get the Batts side of the story!

We then take a very scenic ride and guided tour with the minister of The Red River
Baptist Church (where the Bells all attended) to see all of the sites where the Bell
Witch haunting action took place...the Bell farm, the Bell cemetery, and learn about the Bell Witch cave
and its story, and more...ending at the Bell School where master story teller Tim Henson will provide
additional information on the town and Witch and show you some of the remarkable history up close and
personally—even touring the doctor's office, barber shop, and the last building standing created from the
logs of the original Bell haunted house. We will also see a delightful documentary on the entire subject
to explain it to those who are unfamiliar.

From there we will make our way to a local apple orchard where they still press homemade cider and even fry apple pies. What could be better than this on a crisp autumn day? We will even get to see the Great Pumpkin Charlie Brown on the ride back home!!
